TIME FOR SUMMER HOUSE CLEANING!

Beginning on Monday, July 16, 2018, we are scheduled to have a large trash bin located in our Car Wash Area for everyone's use to help rid ourselves of any accumulated junk and

PARKING STALL USE

We wanted to pass on a reminder regarding the use of parking stalls in the garage. The house rules permit the use of the parking stalls for motor vehicles and boats on trailers that fit within the space of the parking stalls. No other items may be stored or left in the parking stalls. That means that you cannot leave your vehicle washing materials; bicycles; beach items such as chairs, umbrellas, etc.; baby strollers, surfboards or any other personal items, in the parking stalls. UPDATE ON PAINTING PROJECT

Just an update on the progress of Eko Painting. They are currently working on the West Building apartments at the B, C and A stacks. Eko has also started their prep work in the hallways performing spall repairs and then painting the hallway walls and ceilings. They have moved around the corner to the Putting Green side of the West "A" apartments on the sheer walls and will soon be working in front of the dining room and small bedroom windows. Because they are working above the Putting Green area they have asked that residents not walk through that area going to or from the pool due to men working above. You may access the pool through the West Lobby entrance. Also, for our West Building residents, now that Eko has begun working on the hallway side of the building, we will once again be experiencing noise from concrete work on the hallway walls and floors. We are hoping that it will not be as bad as some of the work on the front of the building but please be aware of this. Finally, when they get to painting of the hallway floors there will be even more inconvenience to our residents. The days that they are painting your floor we will need everyone to make arrangements to be out of the building by 8:00 a.m., so that you do not return until after 4:30 p.m. on the day(s) they are working on your floor. Unless it is a medical emergency, anyone who walks on the wet paint will be responsible for any costs to re-do it. We will send notices ahead of time so please plan accordingly.



FIREWORKS PROHIBITED!!



Just a quick reminder that fireworks are not permitted to be used on Mauna Luan premises. Although some of our residents may really like to "cut loose," the majority of our residents would still like to maintain the noise at a reasonable level, so we need to ask that all fireworks and loud parties be taken elsewhere. Since Kailua and Waikiki usually have some of the nicest fireworks displays for the 4th, hopefully that can hold everyone's attention so we don't have problems here. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated by everyone!

NEW CABLE TV AND INTERNET CONTRACT

As everyone should be aware by now, we began a new contract with Spectrum (formerly Oceanic Cable) effective June 1, 2018. As many of you will also be aware, the transition has not been smooth. We are still receiving complaints from some of our residents that they are being charged for things that should be a part of the contract and/or not receiving good service on either television or Internet. As a recap, every apartment can now have two (2) cable boxes *FREE* with additional boxes at \$6.99 each. Up to four (4) cable boxes will also have DVR (recording) services *FREE*. Each apartment is also now provided the Ultra Internet service *FREE* which provides up to 400 Mbs speed. This comes with a modem and *FREE* wireless router. One issue that has come up with Internet speed is that some of the older equipment cannot process the faster speeds. If you had Internet service previously, and have not already done so, please contact Spectrum at 643-2337, to have them check your equipment to be sure you can accept the faster speed. If not, they will need you to take your old equipment to the Spectrum location in Koko Marina Shopping Center and swap it for a new modem and router. If your equipment is sufficient, they should be able to send you the new speed from their location. If you would like to check your Internet speed you can go to: <u>www.speedtest.net.</u> We did also lose premium channels Showtime and HBO on this contract. If anyone would like to pick them back up, the cost is \$14.99 each, unless you sign up for a bundled package which will provide HBO, Showtime and Cinemax all for \$20.00 per month. They will need to upgrade you to Spectrum Silver but that does not cost any additional. If anyone still has problems, please call us at 395-7544. Mahalo!
